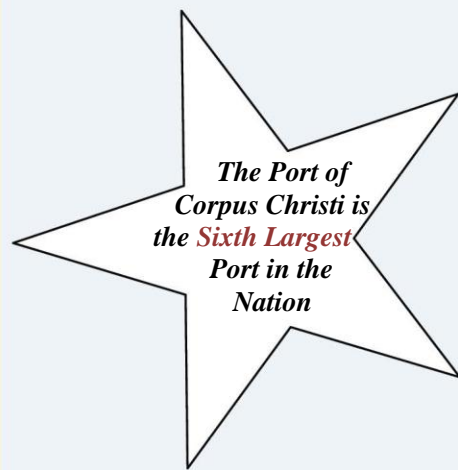

Texas A&M University - Corpus Christi

Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi is a four-year university that offers numerous bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees in five colleges: Business, Education, Nursing & Health Sciences, Science & Technology, and Liberal Arts.

Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi, located on its own 240-acre island, features state-of-the-art learning centers, support facilities, student apartments and its own beach. Surrounded by the Corpus Christi and Oso Bays, the campus is approximately ten miles from downtown Corpus Christi.

Del Mar College

Del Mar is a comprehensive community college that offers academic, occupational and non-credit courses.
